Big Developments at Malau School

The first time we visited Malau school it consisted of a single nursery class but today it has grown to include a primary school. The village has embarked upon a massive building programme to accommodate the primary pupils. When we arrived the roof was about to go on to a classroom for the fifth form pupils. St Margaret's Church in Olton donated money to complete this project. They have plans to build three more classrooms to complete their project and provide education for all the pupils. Some are taught in the church at the moment and others have to attend school in the afternoons. It was so commendable to see a village working together. They have made all their own bricks to complete the project but do need money to pay for the labour, cement and the roof panels. They were very appreciative of the money we donated to the school and for the gift of books.



Disappointing News

We were all disappointed that we could not visit Kaloleni Nursery School but the building has been deemed unfit for use as a school. The school is still open but the School Board were not happy for us to visit. It did not seem appropriate to donate money to the school under the circumstances so the money allocated was given to Malau as the school is growing.

Plea from St John's School

We have received a request from St John's Girls School to help with a programme to provide the basic needs of the girls who arrive without the required personal effects like bathing soap, washing soap, toothpaste, toilet paper, pens, pencils, shoe polish, body oil, hair oil and sanitary towels. In support of this programme they depend on well-wishers and are getting worried as they only have stock that will last to the end of term. They require 15 000 Kenyan shillings per term or 45000ksh per year to fund this initiative (15000 ksh =£125 and 45000ksh = £375 approximately)

Rising Costs

We are all aware that prices are continually rising. This is not just a British problem but also very much a problem in Kenya. The cost of education is included in these price rises. Unfortunately the Trustees have had no option but to increase the price of sponsorship.

£20 is the cost of nursery education £300 is the cost of a student at a secondary school for a year
